Outreach (continued):

St. Herman's Church in Shillington was also able to continue its support for MARY'S SHELTER, a shelter that provides housing and support for displaced or homeless families and/or single/pregnant mothers. The parish also participated in the OCA/Diocese of Alaska Support Collection that was held in December. The doors of St. Herman's have always been open to guests, Orthodox as well as non-Orthodox, to attend our Divine Services and various programs. Presently, a few "neighbors" have joined us in worship and the Adult Education program on Sundays.

Challenges:

As previously stated and as expressed in the OCA Survey, C-19 had a profound effect on our Church and Parish Life. Although St. Herman's did not experience any direct C-19 losses, the consequences, both physical and spiritual, of the pandemic were felt by the parish. Although there is a definite lessening of fear, the return to normalcy and positive outlook, 2020-2022, has been a struggle. Like many parishes we had to adapt spiritually and liturgically, carefully and conscientiously maintain our financial stability, and continue to not only exist, but to grow physically and faithfully as a community in and of the Vineyard of Christ.

Fr. John Onofrey has a weekly Adult Education & Discussion Class on Sundays prior to the Liturgy. The average attendance of this class is 15-20, which sometimes includes some children and teens.

There are plans to re-establish the weekly Bible Study that was suspended during the C-19 period.
