Report of the Secretary of the Diocesan Council

The following report outlines the highlights of the Diocesan Council Meetings held since the last Diocesan Assembly held at the Gus Genetti Motor Lodge in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania on September 14 and 15, 1979:

The 66th Diocesan Council Meeting — October 10, 1979 — Wilkes-Barre, Pa.

- 1. It was decided after a lengthy report presented by Priest Robert Kondratick that the Diocese would engage the Continental Data Processing Firm of Wilkes-Barre, Pa. for the computerization of all parishioners of the parishes of Eastern Pennsylvania.
- 2. His Grace, Bishop Herman announced that Archpriest George Pawlush and he would meet directly with Attorney Nicholas Barna to begin the discussions as to the proper ownership of the Children's Home Complex with the Russian Orthodox Catholic Mutual Aid Society.
- 3. All Deans were to discuss fund raising projects with their respective clergy for the benefit of the Diocesan structure.
- 4. It was decided that a \$3000.00 interest free loan be granted to the Mission Church of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross in Williamsport, Pennsylvania from the Mission Account of the Diocese.
- 5. His Eminence, Archbishop Kiprian announced that all department chairmen and officers are appointed for a one year term and are confirmed after each Diocesan Assembly. The following appointments were made:

6. It was resolved that the next Diocesan Assembly would take place on Friday and Saturday, September 5th and 6th, 1980 at the Gus Genetti Motor Lodge in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania.

The 67th Diocesan Council Meeting — December 13, 1979 — Wilkes-Barre, Pa.

- 1. His Grace, Bishop Herman stated that the Diocesan Assembly minutes had been corrected and the Diocesan Council Secretary mailed copies to all parishes of the Diocese.
- 2. Priest Robert Kondratick reported as to the general response given by the clergy and parishes councils to the census report. All clergy would receive a direct correspondence from the Archbishop as to the final date that all information should be received by the Diocesan Chancery.
- 3. Priest Dionysius Swencki reported on the various workshops, lectures and retreats that would be held by the Department of Religious Education in the Diocese. Father Swencki stated that a questionnaire would be mailed to all parish priests concerning the status of all Church School programs in the Diocesan Churches.
- 4. Priest Daniel Kovalak presented a written report as to the goals and aspirations of the Department of Public Relations. The report was accepted and made a part of the Diocesan Minutes.
- 5. His Grace, Bishop Herman announced that a chairman for the Department of Stewardship could not be found at the present time and that consideration would be given to this matter in the near future.
- 6. Archpriest Joseph Martin and Mr. Donald Motel representatives to the Metropolitan Council of the Orthodox Church in America, reported on the activities of this council. The main purpose of this meeting was to discuss the Budget for 1980 of the National Church. It was announced that there would be a deficit in this budget.
- 7. His Eminence, Archbishop Kiprian gave an updated report of the status of the Pension for the Orthodox Church in America. There were many questions asked concerning the future of the program and its stability. His Eminence stated that he would keep the Diocesan Council informed of the decisions made by the Pension Board.
- 8. It was announced that a letter was received from Mr. Richard Reidy, Treasurer of the Orthodox Church in America concerning delinquent parish assessments for the year 1979 from parishes within our Diocese. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided the Diocesan Treasurer, Priest Paul Ropitsky, would send a statement to each parish of the Diocese concerning their accounts.
- 9. It was announced that a choir directors' conference would be held during the month of August in 1980. Priest Theodore Heckman would be in charge.

The 68th Diocesan Council Meeting — March 18, 980 — Nanticoke, Pa.

- 1. Priest Robert Kondratick reported that as of this date there were only four parishes which did not respond to the Diocesan Census report: Coatesville, Dundaff, Pennsylvania (St. Mary's) and Shenandoah. A total accounting of all parishes will be prepared for the next Diocesan Council Meeting.
- 2. It was announced that there would be a meeting of the National Department of Stewardship and that Mr. Donald Motel would attend to represent our Diocese.
- 3. His Grace, Bishop Herman stated that he and Archpriest George Pawlush are still trying to arrange a meeting with the representatives of the ROCMAS to discuss the ownership of the Children's Home building which now houses the Diocesan Auxiliary Bishop and Chancery. The council decided that no improvements could b made to the building until final ownership is resolved. A complete report will be given to the Diocesan Assembly on this matter.
- 4. A discussion took place concerning a resolution that should be sent to the Pre-Sobor Commission concerning the adoption of the REVISED JULIAN CALENDAR as the norm for the Orthodox Church in America. His Eminence, Archbishop Kiprian stated that this matter should be tabled.
- 5. It was resolved that the payments to the Diocese by each local church for the National and Diocesan assessments should be made quarterly. The Diocesan Treasurer, Priest Paul Ropitsky, was instructed to begin sending out quarterly statements to each parish.

The 69th Diocesan Council Meeting — June 12, 1980 — South Canaan, Pa.

- 1. It was noted that all parishes have responded to the Diocesan Census. Some changes are being made by the pastors and a complete report was distributed to all those present.
- 2. Oral reports were presented by all departments of the Diocese to the Diocesan Council concerning their activities and plans for the future programs in the Diocese.
- 3. His Grace, Bishop Herman gave an extensive report concerning the progress of both Stroudsburg and Williamsport parishes. It was decided that we would continue to fund the Church of the Holy Cross in Williamsport the sum of \$200.00 per month for the forthcoming year to help defray their financial burdens.
- 4. Archpriest Joseph Martin gave a report concerning the Metropolitan Council Meeting held on April 22nd in New York City. The report centered on the financial problems besetting the National Church and the reading of the agenda of the forthcoming All American Council.
- 5. His Grace, Bishop Herman reported that a meeting was held with the representatives of the ROCMAS and that there are no legal complications to be considered with the acquisition of the Children's Home as the Diocesan Center.
- 6. It was resolved that a special session would be held the evening before the assembly with representatives from each parish council to be in attendance. Mr. Richard Reidy of the National Church would lead the discussions concerning finances.
- 7. All reports of the Departments are be in by July 20, 1980 to the Diocesan Secretary for duplication.
- 8. A motion was made to present the resolution at the Diocesan Assembly concerninghe adoption of the Revised Julian Calendar and the All American Church Council.
- 9. His Eminence, Archbishop Kiprian appointed the following to a Diocesan Liturgical Commission:

The 70th Diocesan Council Meeting — August 19, 1980 — South Canaan, Pa.

- 1. The Agenda of the forthcoming Diocesan Assembly was read and confirmed by the Diocesan Council.
- 2. The Budget for the forthcoming year of 1981 was confirmed for presentation to the Diocesan Assembly.
- 3. His Grace, Bishop Herman announced that the Diocesan Newsletter and the publication of Church and Home would be combined.
- 4. It was resolved that due to the fact that the National Department of Missions would not be funding completely the \$200.00 per month to the Diocesan Mission of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross in Williamsport that the Diocese would fund the amount of \$125.00 difference in the allotment for the forthcoming year only.
- 5. His Eminence Archbishop Kprian stated that a new lay delegate at large would be appointed at the first Diocesan Council Meeting after the Assembly.

REPORT OF THE FRACKVILLE DEANERY TO THE DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY OF PHILADELPHIA AND EASTERN PENNSYLVANIA - 1980 - WILKES-BARRE, PENNSYLVANIA

The deanery consists of 12 parishes serviced by 7 full time priests and two part time. At this time the parishes of St. Herman's of Shillington and St. Mary's of Coaldale are vacant.

Effective August 15, 1980 the parish in Mt. Carmel, St. Michaels received a new paster in the name of Rev. Samuel Garula. Welcome abward.

The clergy met three times during the past year on a deanery level.

The majoirty of the parishes had a lenten mission service this past year and the clergy participated in the annual Sunday of Orthodoxy Service in Hely Resurrection Cathedral in Wilkes-Barre.

The annual Frackville Deanery Family Day picnic we held in Angela Park on July 15. There ever 125 people in attendance.

Diocesan Assembly Report September 5 & 6, 1980

GENERAL

The Wilkes-Barre Deanery includes 17 parishes in Northeastern Pennsylvania. Three Deanery meetings were held since the last report.

LENTEN MISSIONS

The Deanery coordinates Mission Vespers during Great Lent. This year all of the priests of the Deanery participated in five Vesper services instead of dividing in two groups each Sunday, as in years past. Sunday of Orthodoxy was celebrated at Holy Resurrection Cathedral. Churches not visited in 1979 were visited in 1980.

PUBLICATIONS

A supply of the pamphlet "The Blessing of Motherhood", prepared for mothers-to-be, is still available at 10¢ per copy. A three-fold pamphlet entitled "To Help You To Pray", published last year, is still being distributed free-of-charge to the sick in the hospitals and homes by the clergy of the Deanery. Six other three-fold pamphlets, produced under the supervision of Father Daniel Kovalak, were distributed free-of-charge to the faithful of the Deanery.

VISUAL AID LIBRARY

The Deanery now has a Visual Aid and Religious Tape Library to be used by Deanery priests or Church School supervisors. More than \$500.00 was expended for same this past year. Distribution of slides and tapes is under the direction of Father David Lisko.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are still available for third semester Deanery seminiarians. There were no applicants in 1979-1980.

RADIO GRANT

The Deanery gave a donation of \$500.00 to Father Vladimir Borichevsky to help defray the cost of his weekly radio program "The Hour of Orthodoxy". The program is broadcast over a local radio station. Tapes are available to other areas.

ALUMNI NEWSLETTER

The Deanery sponsored one issue of the Saint Tikhon's Alumni Association Newsletter.

PROJECTS

The Deanery is planning a cultural program sometimes in the future, to gain funds for the treasury.
